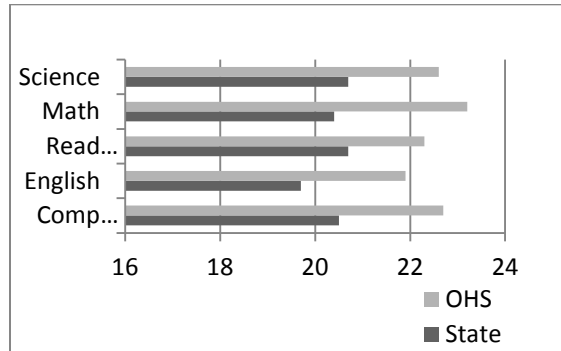

DISTRICT STRATEGIC GOALS

By 2022-2023:

- 100% of all seniors who indicate they are applying to a 4-year college or university will have a composite score of 23 or higher on the ACT college entrance test
- 100% of all seniors who indicate they are applying to a 4-year college or university will have successfully completed one Advanced Placement (AP) exam with a score of 3 or higher
- 90% of all seniors who take the ACT exam will achieve an individual composite score of 19 or higher
- 95% of those juniors participating in the WorkKeys assessment will receive Silver rating or higher

SCHOOL

Onalaska High School is a four-year, public school with an enrollment of 928, including 224 seniors. The school population is representative of a multicultural student body.

FACULTY RATIOS

Of the 67 certified teaching staff, 79% have masters or higher degrees. Student-teacher ratio is 22:1.

CURRICULUM

OHS offers preparatory classes in academic and career areas such as: English, Social Studies, Art, Math, Science, Music, Business & Marketing, Family & Consumer Education, Technology Education, PE/Health and 2 International Languages (Spanish & French). OHS also offers 15 AP classes and 5 Advanced Standing courses.

GPA & CLASS RANK

GPA is computed by using *unweighted* semester grades beginning with ninth grade (reference board policy 5615 and 5616 for exceptions). All grades are included in the computation of class rank, unless otherwise indicated on an individual student's transcript. The highest GPA is 4.00.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Onalaska High School requires 24 credits for graduation. (Board Policy 5512).
